## Description

Colorless, ruby, opaque white, green lead glasses; blown, cut, gilded. Ovoid body with flaring top cut into ten scalloped petals, spreading hollow foot flat on the bottom. Vase is blown of colorless glass with overlays of ruby, opaque white and opaque green, in that order; the ruby glass covers the entire surface except for the neck; the lower two thirds of the body have the green over white

petals extending up from the base and the foot has green over white petals extending down and white ones which project to edge of foot; the base has six green and white scallops showing on the ruby surface with a ground pontil mark in the center. The surface has been completely cut and polished due to the cutting of the top layers and there is additional gilt decoration on the top rim and all over the neck, body and foot.
